

## Frequently Asked Questions - FAQ's

### **What are the project limits?**

The limits of the study extend from U.S. 1 at Kennedy Parkway in unincorporated Volusia County north to Dale Avenue in the City of Edgewater. The project is approximately 13 miles in length and part of the St. Johns River to Sea Loop Trail, which traverses parts of Brevard, Volusia, St. Johns and Putnam Counties.

### **What is a PD&E Study?**

A Project Development & Environment (PD&E) Study is a process conducted by FDOT to assess a transportation project's impacts on the natural, social, physical and human environments and to develop a balanced approach to meeting the needs of the project while minimizing impacts.

### **What is the purpose of this study?**

The objective of this study is to select and evaluate a 12-foot, multi-use trail option that meets the purpose and need of the project. This project is part of a greater effort to close the gaps and complete the St. Johns River to Sea Loop.

### **How can I get involved?**

### **When will this project be built?**

After this study is complete the resulting recommendations will be advanced into the design phase, which is not currently funded. Following the design phase, if needed, right-of-way acquisition will take place (if needed), followed by construction. The entire process can take several years, depending on the availability of funding and other factors.

### **When will the study be finished?**

This PD&E Study began in May 2017 and is anticipated to be completed in fall 2018. A schedule of events is provided in the Project Files section of this website.
