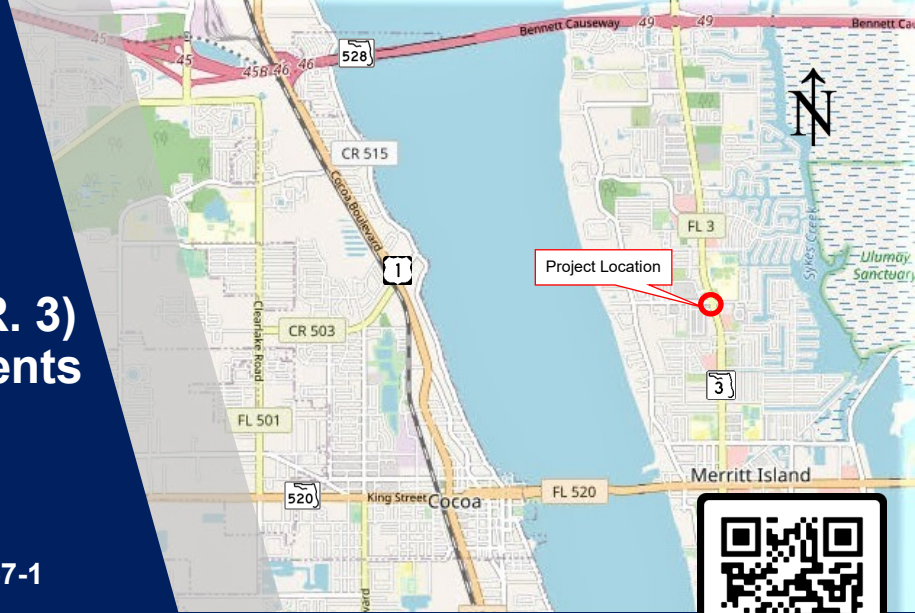




North Courtenay Parkway (S.R. 3) Intersection Safety Improvements at Mustang Way/Lucas Road

Project Description

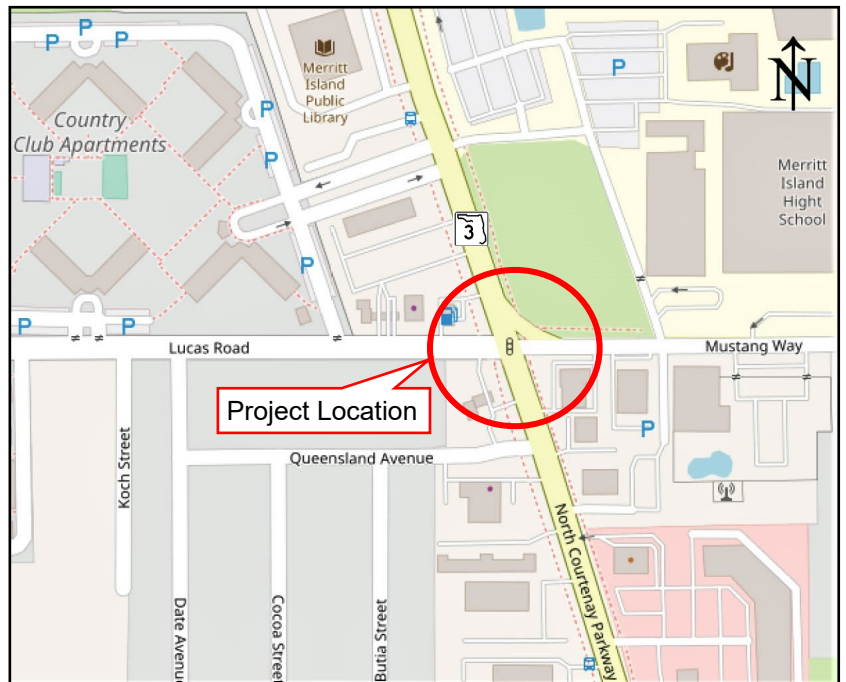
The Florida Department of Transportation (FDOT) is finalizing its plans for improvements at the intersection of North Courtenay Parkway (State Road (S.R.) 3) and Mustang Way/Lucas Road in Merritt Island. The purpose of the project is to enhance safety for pedestrians and drivers.

Project improvements include reconstructing and upgrading the traffic signals and signal poles, as well as installing new accessible pedestrian safety signals at all corners of the intersection. The new pedestrian signals provide verbal indications and have raised markings on the signal buttons for Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) accommodations.

Other pedestrian safety measures involve realigning all crosswalks, adding high-visibility pavement markings, and upgrading lighting. New sidewalk will be added along southbound North Courtenay Parkway and sidewalk curb ramps will be upgraded to current ADA standards.

Additionally, a raised concrete island with a pedestrian signal and crosswalk will be constructed beside the right turn lane from Mustang Way to North Courtenay Parkway. The project will also reconstruct all of the corner curbs to shorten pedestrian crossing distances.

Drainage improvements, and repaving the roadway within the project limits are also planned. No changes to the roadway configuration are planned.
