

Develop and evaluate alternatives to improve operations along S.R. 535, accommodate future traffic demand, and improve safety.





Existing Traffic Demand

- 29,500 to 56,000 Vehicles per Day
- Intersections are experiencing delays

Future Traffic Demand (2045)

- 39,000 to 73,500 Vehicles per Day
- Traffic is anticipated to grow by <u>30%</u>
 - Increased delays








BICYCLE AND PEDESTRIAN NEEDS

 Numerous pedestrian and bicycle crashes along the corridor within a five-year period








ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED



No Build

- Maintains existing 4 lanes
- >>> Discontinuous pedestrian and bicycle facilities
- >>> No facility improvements/changes

ALTERNATIVES CONSIDERED



Build Alternatives (6 Lanes)

- >>> Inside or outside widening alternatives
- >>> Shared Use Paths
- >>> Stormwater Treatments
- >>> Intersection improvements

PREFERRED TYPICAL SECTION



- >>> Three 11-foot travel lanes in each direction
- >>> Shared use paths on both sides

- >>> A median width that varies from 32 feet to 47 feet
- >>> Typical section is anticipated to fit within right of way




MEDIAN U-TURN (MUT)




QUADRANT ROAD











PARTIAL MEDIAN U-TURN OPERATIONS










PARTIAL DISPLACED LEFT OPERATIONS







At this time, the right of way acquisition and construction project phases are not funded.









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
